We can use technical analysis strictly how the indicators were intended to be used. (For example for Bollinger bands, if we cross above the upper boundary, thats a sell signal and when we cross above the lower boundary thats a buy signal). OR. We can mix multiple indicators for entry conditions and multiple indicators for exit conditions.
