Minimum Standards for Social Worker Involvement in the Care of ESRD Patients Standards 1. Evidence of a psychosocial evaluation by a qualifi ed social worker will be documented in the patient's medical record* not later than one month after initiation of dialysis. 2.

We note that 42 CFR 494.90(b)(4) requires that the dialysis facility must ensure that all dialysis patients are seen by a physician, nurse practitioner, clinical nurse specialist, or physician's assistant providing ESRD care at least monthly, as evidenced by a monthly progress note placed in the medical record.

ESRD Conditions for Coverage (CFCs) Final Rule Rollout ...

• Ideally, patients should leave each dialysis treatment at their dry weight. • Unfortunately, excess fluid gains prevent achievement of dry weight: Non-adherence to dialysis prescription; Too-short dialysis duration; and/or Excess dietary sodium.

Good Assessment and Documentation Skills Can Lead to ...

The patient care plan must include, as applicable, education and training for patients and family members or caregivers or both, in aspects of the dialysis experience, dialysis management, infection prevention and personal care, home dialysis and self-care, health- related quality of life, rehabilitation, transplantation, and the benefits and risks of various vascular access types.
