Excel- Vertical Analysis, Horizontal Analysis

A Vertical Analysis can be completed on both an Income Statement and a Balance Sheet. Unlike Horizontal Analysis, a Vertical Analysis is confined within one year (or one vertical column of the Balance Sheet); so we only need one period of data to derived the percentages and completed the analysis.

Vertical Analysis (VA) Just as horizontal analysis, it is applied to the balance sheet or income statement. Unlike horizontal analysis, which compares evolution between different years, vertical analysis compares how much an account holds towards the total group of accounts to which it belongs.

Vertical analysis of financial statements is a technique in which the relationship between items in the same financial statement is identified by expressing all amounts as a percentage a total amount. This method compares different items to a single item in the same accounting period.

The analysis determines the relative weight of each account and its share in asset resources or revenue generation. In the common size, each element of financial statements (Both Income
